HOW MUCH DO WE SPEND?



The Air Force has increased SB opportunities in prime and subcontracting:

- In FY20: The Air Force awarded \$63,259,486,136 in prime contracts of which \$14,414,747,303 or 22.79% was awarded to SB
- In FY19: The Air Force awarded \$65,581,173,315 in prime contracts of which \$12,838,031,190 or 19.58%
- In FY20: The Air Force reported \$766,696,412 in subcontracting dollar of which \$159,243,450 or 20.8%
- In FY19: The Air Force reported \$782,082,265 in subcontracting dollar of which \$156,711,992 or 20%

 SBPs advise Contracting Officers to include SB Participation in the Source Selection as an evaluation criteria

OSBP has not assigned SB Subcontracting goals and FY20 data is not available at this time

FY19 DoD achieved 38.6% in excess of 32% goal in SB subcontracting





SUBCONTRACTING CHALLENGES

The Electronic Subcontracting Reporting System (eSRS) is part of the President's Management Agenda for Electronic Government:

- Developed to collect subcontracting accomplishments
- This Internet-based tool
- Eliminates the need for paper submissions

HOW WE ARE SUCCEEDING

DoD Comprehensive Subcontracting Test Program

- Expires on December 31, 2027 and determines comprehensive subcontracting plans on a corporate, division, and plant-wide basis
- How contractors are eligible to participate
- 9 companies participated in CSP in 2019:
